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Flexibility with you in mind

The programme has been designed with you in mind and recognises that it is not always possible to attend formal courses in a classroom for the day. The programme can offer you bite size learning experiences, allowing you to choose when you learn throughout the year at a time more convenient for you. It will offer you a combined approach to learning or updating care skills using practical and information sessions. You will then be able to transfer the knowledge and skills into all aspects of your care ensuring that the child and family receive a consistent high standard first time, every time.

The Programme

The programmes itself contains bite size learning sessions. Some sessions will remain core to the programme but the programme may be amended to reflect the changing care needs of the child and family or demands of service.

The sessions include

Policy and guidance for HCA's, Privacy and Dignity, Communication, Play and Distraction, Nutrition, Taking observations, Bereavement Care and well as a variety of clinical skills sessions.

How to get on to the programme Ideally this development should be identified as part of your personal development review. Sessions will be advertised on the Intranet and in the Trust newsletters with further information on how to book onto sessions.

Life after the programme

Once you have completed your programme of learning there can be other learning activities you may wish to consider should you wish to do so. As part of the programme you will be advised on your next steps and other learning opportunities which may be available to you. The main aim of the programme is to provide a consistent approach HCA development and patient care.
