Susan Jones

Job Title: Head of Clinical Professions/Co-Chair of North West AHP Workforce Board

Organisation: The Pennine Acute Hospitals NHS Trust

Role: Responsible for the operational and strategic management of 8 services i.e. Audiology, Nutrition and Dietetics, Occupational Therapy, Orthotics, Orthoptics, Podiatry, Physiotherapy and Speech and Language Therapy. Also acts as the AHP lead for the trust. A member of the trust's strategic management group and workforce board and leads on workforce planning for the trust's division of Diagnostics and Clinical Support.

Professional Career: Qualified as a Dietitian in 1981 and following a clinical career in dietetics took up the role of Dietetic Service Manager for the then Rochdale Healthcare NHS Trust in 1988. Appointed to current post in 2004. Active role in the British Dietetic Association where has held many positions including that of Chairman from 2003-2005. Member of National AHP Advisory Board 2009-2012. Member of North West AHP Workforce Board since its formation and has recently taken on the role of co-chair of the Board.

Job Title: North West AHP Workforce Lead/Co-Chair of North West AHP Workforce Board

Organisation: Health Education North West

Role: Responsible for the management and delivery of work programmes to support the development of the regional AHP workforce, to ensure it is fit for purpose and able to deliver excellent care. This includes developing leadership capability, supporting the work of the North West Modernisation Hub to develop new ways of working and innovative roles, supporting strategies for graduate employment and influencing CPD priorities.

Co-chair of the North West AHP Workforce Board and through this Board facilitates the provision of professional workforce and education intelligence to key stakeholders. Also provides professional leadership to all AHPs across the region and ensures there are effective systems in place to support two way communications with them.

Professional Career: Qualified as a Dietitian in 1990 and undertook a series of clinical and leadership roles in a number of hospitals. 1996-2004 was Dietetic Manager across an acute hospital trust and their local community services. 1999-2002 also undertook the role of lead manager for education and training across the AHP services and from 2002-2004 was the AHP lead role for clinical governance.
