Master Class Three - Educating the Educator

Aim:

Master class three will focus on the development of health care education in practice across the networks. Contemporary evidenced frameworks that enable educators to monitor and assess learning and behaviours will be covered with particular focus on the development of collaborative and cross-boundary mentorship. How to capitalise existing high levels of experiential knowledge from across the networks will be discussed and form the focus of the afternoon's practical skills session.

- 1. Supporting educators to assess and monitor learning and behaviours that demonstrate compassionate care that places the patient at the heart of safe practice
