Master Class Two – Techniques to Evaluate Effective Learning

Aim:

In the spirit of developing a culture of continuous improvement it is essential to establish the means and metrics to measure the effectiveness of quality improvements. In this the second masterclass, effective evaluation techniques will be explored to bring further rigor and relevance to support the current evidence-based practices of the placement networks. Methods of data sampling, collection, analysis and critical evaluation will be discussed, together with the presentation techniques that can be used to effectively disseminate work-based learning. As with master class one, the format of the day will incorporate a morning masterclass followed by an afternoon practical skills session.

Learning outcomes:

- 1. Understand quality assurance reporting techniques that develops knowledge to influence change and development.
- 2. An ability to creatively configure findings, drawing both from existing policy, evidence, current practice and upcoming initiatives.
- 3. Be able to present findings in a high level written report, seminars, posters and case studies.

Additional comments to support the outcomes above for this Master Class:

- Quality improvement should be integral to all network activities- need to consider competencies for network members to deliver quality improvement and enable others (mentors and indeed learners) to do so also
- Suggest action learning and research as an approach to evaluate effectively: underpinned with emphasis on continuous improvement and learning
- Emphasis needed on report writing skills to complete effectively tools, templates and frameworks for reporting; maximising the diversity of scope in evidencing approaches; relevance of measurement or tool used to source and provide information; analysing the effectiveness/ineffectiveness of approach & outcome; and, capturing that learning within the process; truthfulness/accuracy. No gaps. Following instructions to enable complete and fair analysis-FOR NOTING- Example current reporting templates are attached- this will change with the HEE Quality Assurance Framework but this is the example currently used. HEE NW will advise when new reporting templates will be implemented -these will be multiprofessional across medical and non-medical professions.
- Action planning and continuous improvement, identifying themes, and trends.
- Support in identifying impact measures in evaluation
