Education Journey

From her school days, Margaret was told that she was "not worth teaching" after making a spelling mistake in class. While she outwardly laughed along with her classmates, inside she just "curled up and died". For her, education and career were also not something that was encouraged; she said quite simply, "you can get further education out of your head!" It was only recently that Margaret was encouraged to take the path of education again, as her NVQ assessor, Nicola Crawley, asked if she was interested in the apprenticeship programme. Margaret's initial reaction was that it wasn't for her - she felt she was "too thick" to be able to complete the programme.

Nicola's confidence in her allowed Margaret to give the apprenticeship a go, and she knew it was time to bury the demons that had haunted her for more than 30 years. Margaret told us that she put everything into the course, day and night after work, and she began to feel proud of herself. This was all worthwhile as she achieved distinctions in her work! She also never felt like she was alone, with ample support available and the reassurance that doors will always be open for her whenever she needed.
