



EVENT OVERVIEW: NORTH OF ENGLAND HEALTH VISITING CELEBRATE, SHARE AND LEARN EVENT

NHS England, in partnership with Health Education England, hosted the North of England Health Visiting Celebrate, Share and Learn event at the Hilton Leeds City on 15 October 2014. The event was chaired by Teresa Fenech, Deputy Director: Quality Assurance, NHS England who gave a warm welcome to almost 200 health visiting professionals from across the North, including; health visitors, midwives, school nurses, local authority staff, managers and other early years staff.

The event provided a platform for health visiting professionals to network, share best practice and celebrate their achievements. There were a series of posters displayed as a mode to share good practice. For example, Lancashire Care NHS Foundation Trust displayed a poster on building community capacity. There was also a host of stalls at the event, offering support to health visitors. There were representatives from Unite, Teeside University and the Institute of Health Visiting.

The session began with a welcome from the Chair, followed by plenary sessions from Diane Massey and Melita Walker from the Institute of Health Visiting. The plenaries discussed how the Institute supports health visitors in practice, fundraising and the innovative work the organisation is involved with. Teresa Fenech continued the event, delivering her plenary on health visiting across the North. The morning was concluded with the first of three workshop sessions.

Following lunch, the afternoon session was opened by keynote speaker, John Wilbraham, Chief Executive, East Cheshire NHS Trust. John was named as one of the top 50 NHS Chief Executives by the Healthcare Science Journal in 2014, and leads on 'The Caring Together, Connecting Care, Healthier Together, Southern Sector Partnership and Challenged Health Economy Programmes', where focus is given to improving access, quality and timeliness of care.

John presented 'improving care through staff engagement' and showed a short film, 'Employee Engagement - Who's Sinking Your Boat?'. The plenary was extremely well received: it had a good response on Twitter with @redwen1 tweeting "The employment engagement video really makes you think" and it was described as "inspirational" in the feedback session at the end of the event.

The event was concluded with closing remarks from the chair and an informal feedback session. The feedback was very positive. The event also had a good response on social media and a summary of the Twitter activity can be found on Storify.
